## Analyst Training Program Report September 10, 2022

Report to the CSJA from the ATP Training Committee:

- I. The ATP has 15 candidates, and we are welcoming four new candidates this fall
- II. Curriculum review
  - a. In addition to our standing courses including History and Development (years one and three) and our Pre/Post-Propedeuticum Consultation Courses we will be offering:
    - i. Metaphysical and Scientific Aspects of Jung's Praxis taught by Ken James
      - 1. Ken's course will apply Jung's praxis to a variety of topics such as artificial intelligence, phenomenology, mysticism (East and West), esoteric practices, and the numinous all in an effort to help model an analytic attitude- respect for the wide varieties of psyche's expressions
    - ii. Affect Regulation, Attachment, and Dissociation taught by Arlo Compaan
      - 1. Beginning with Jung's views of feeling, affect and emotion, Arlo's course explores the centrality of affect in defending against the intolerable feelings in Trauma and the analytic process of bringing to consciousness the warded off feelings and their bodily experience. By brining to consciousness intolerable experience, both positive and negative, psyche returns to living more fully.
    - iii. Complex Adaptive Systems taught by George Hogenson
      - 1. George will present Complexity Theory as it relates to Analytical Psychology including application to the notion of complex, archetype, and synchronicity
  - b. And, for the second year, each weekend will open with a course entitled, Ritual and Improvisation taught by Dyane Sherwood and Boris Matthews
    - i. Heralding the need for attention to the symbol, symbolic imagining, and the creative, Dyane and Boris initiate each training weekend by inviting the candidates to bring to the meeting a symbol of some sort that has

caught their attention. The alchemy of the course invites an immersion into the nexus of subjectivity, objectivity, and the soul's need for expressive meaning

- c. We will also be continuing with the Process Group
- d. Finally, our December Training Weekend will welcome Mark Winborn as our guest Analyst; we are still fine tuning his presentation topics
